The Preface



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The Prism synthesizes different perspectives and reflections on Greek reality in 27 multi-media stories, presented in an extensive website, a feature film, a mobile exhibition and a book publication.

1.1 Project Outline

by Nikos Katsaounis and Nina Maria Paschalidou

The Prism is a collective multimedia exploration documenting Greece during the winter of 2010-2011. It is the brainchild of filmmakers Nikos Katsaounis and Nina Maria Paschalidou.

In the winter of 2010, with Greece in the midst of a financial and social meltdown, Nina and Nikos returned home after having lived abroad for many years.

In order to tell the story of a tormented country, they experimented with a new type of narrative. Through a process of creative collaboration, innovation and documentation, they composed a group of 14 photojournalists and videographers and enabled them to make the transition to multimedia storytellers.

1.2 Synopsis

From the time of Herodotus, story-telling has always been the force behind civilizations. The ability to record and document time has passed on memories from generation to generation.

Today, the ability to tell and spread stories is being revolutionized through technology. Journalism is transitioning from the hands of a few to a wide range of people who have been empowered to tell their own stories from their own perspective. This is what gave birth to The Prism. Filmmakers Nikos Katsaounis and Nina Maria Paschalidou conceived The Prism as an innovative way to share their stories.

In January 2010, Greece was hit by an unprecedented economic crisis. The arrival of the IMF marked the beginning of a series of revelations, forcing all those connected to Greece to go through a process of self-reflection.



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Greeks found themselves confronted with multiple questions, regarding not only the future but also the past of the Greek nation and its role in the international terrain. Amongst the ruins and collapsing image of a country at a historical turning point, who are the heroes that emerge from the settling dust?

The Prism GR2010 compiles these different viewpoints, exploring the different dimensions of the afflicted nation. Combining multimedia, a unique story-telling tool, and D-SLR cameras, The Prism is a collective documentation by some of the country's rising photojournalists, who bring to the project their experience as well as their own perspective. In addition, The Prism also combines the forces of prominent journalists, significant Greek musicians and many other creative collaborators, without whom this project could not have happened.

1.3 The Purpose

- (a) To record the Greek reality during this crucial historical tuning point
- (b) To experiment in a new model of creative collaboration in filmmaking

1.4 The Methodology

- (a) Each multimedia storyteller worked on specific topics selected collectively and synthesized a multimedia story (photo-video-text-audio) for each topic.
- (b) Each photographer collaborated with an associate producer who facilitated the production process. In many cases, the photojournalist acted as the associate producer him/herself.

1.5 Technical Execution

Photojournalism will never be the same! Ever since digital SLR cameras have incorporated the ability to shoot HD video, a revolution has occurred in the photojournalist and publisher profession. Nowadays, every newspaper or reporter can publish and produce multimedia content at a very low cost. The ability to coordinate large teams and aggregate their content on web platforms has only become available in the past few years, and will be used to archive the country during this crucial time.

The Prism GR2010 experiments with these cameras in order to test a new collective way of documentary production, creating a new business model for the 21st-century photojournalists/ multimedia storytellers.



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The Structure

2.1 Project Synthesis

The full project will consist of:

- (1) A documentary film of 52' length
- (2) A website containing:
 - 27 multimedia stories, profiles of people from various walks in life and photos from photographers in a collective gallery
 - A mobile exhibition
 - A photographic book

2.4 Biographies

The Directors/Executive Producers:

Nikos Katsaounis is a filmmaker, producer and co-creator of The Prism GR2010, who lives and works in New York City.

After completing his MA in media studies at the New School, he eventually landed in the world of documentary filmmaking. His interest in short format documentaries for the web led him to produce several series online, which combined animation and video.



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Lately, he has been exploring the world of multimedia story telling and has produced and directed many webisodes, a couple of feature films, and animations. The Prism GR2010 is his latest experiment, combining the latest technology and techniques to document Greece during this critical time in its history.

He has been awarded in various occasions for his documentary work, most notably as a member of the NBC team that received an Emmy in 2004. In 2010, he founded N-Coded, a media company that focuses on documentary multimedia production.

This summer he will launch the Beta version of www.tidbit.tv, a new multimedia story-telling tool that he has been working on for a couple of years.

Nina Maria Paschalidou is a filmmaker, journalist and producer with extensive experience on documentaries focused on social strife, war and forgotten populations.

For the past twelve years, Nina has reported for To Vima and Kathimerini, the two major newspapers in Greece. Since 2007, she has been a producer for "Exandas" Documentary Series, an Athens-based documentary group that has won many international awards. She has also produced and directed independent documentaries, such as "Spirited Paths: the life of Human Rights Heroes" and "Boxing Cuba". She is also the author of "Kanun: A child's Play", a documentary book on blood feud in Albania, and "From Chaos to Harmony: The Life of Mikis Theodorakis", a film about the life of the Greek composer.

She is the founder of Forest Troop, an independent documentary and multimedia group and co-owner of www.protagon.gr, a news blog created by prominent Greek journalists.

She received her undergraduate degree in Mass Communications at Boston University and her graduate degree in Entrepreneurship at Bentley University. She has studied film at La Femis in Paris and at the NYU in New York. She is also a Fellow in the School of Foreign Service at Georgetown University, in Washington D.C.

The Prism GR2010 is her first exploration into multimedia story-telling and her attempt to document this critical moment in Greek history.



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The Photographers:

Angeliki Aristomenopoulou is a photographer and a film director specializing in music documentaries.

She has been filming for the Greek public television since 2005, directing World Music documentary series, focusing on music and artists around the world. She has documented the music scene of India ("The Gipsies of Rajasthan"), Istanbul ("The Contemporary Music Scene"), New York ("Nublu Label"), Brazil ("The Samba of Rio"), and Kreuzberg ("The Hip-Hop Scene of the Immigrants in Germany") and many others.



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She has also worked in different projects including "Floating Prisons" and "Wondering Soul", which won the Fipresci Award for Best Greek documentary.

He has worked in advertisement as a director, assistant director, and camera operator in television news. For 4 years now he has directed nearly 80 music videos for well-known artists such as Sakis Rouvas, Eleni Tsalgopoulou, Nikos Portokaloglou, Alkisti Protopsalti, among others.

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White Room is currently producing and directing a documentary series in Net Digital called "How it is made" and beginning the production of a new television comedy series for the younger generations on Skai TV. He has produced two short films: "Yha Hamarra" (2009), and "Play" (2003).

In London, besides working as a photographer, Chryssa works as director and producer of news and documentary films for various broadcasters. She also works as a camera woman and a FinalCut Pro editor.

The Journalists:

Mariniki Alevizopoulou has studied journalism and French literature at the Athens University. She has freelanced for major Greek newspapers, radio and television networks and magazines. Until 2010, she worked as a staff journalist for Lambrakis Press S.A., writing for To Vima daily newspaper and Vimagazino, the weekly supplement of To Vima newspaper.

Her work focuses primarily on social issues, leading her to cover big news events like the 2007 fires in Peloponnese, the 2008 Athens riots, as well as immigration issues. She has travelled extensively, covering major news events around the globe, such as the earthquake in Haiti, the reality on the ground for the Palestinian people in Gaza after the bloodshed caused by the Israeli army on the flotilla which tried to break the embargo in 2010, and the mudslides that devastated Uganda during the same year. Today, she works as a journalist for E, the weekly supplement of Eleftherotypia newspaper, and as a freelancer for various other publications.

Gina Kalovyrna has extensive experience in the coverage of major international events, be they sports - e.g. various Olympic Games in Athens, Torino, Beijing, and Vancouver, or World Athletics Championships, IOC meeting - or political - e.g. Kosovo independence, elections in Greece - for renowned media networks such as CTVS (China TV Service), Reuters, or Schmidtd Media Sports.

Since May 2009, she works as a freelance producer with Reuters News Agency and Schmidt Media Sport Agency. Also, for the past year she has been working as the personal assistant of the cultural attaché of the Danish Embassy in Athens. Gina has extensive experience in television broadcasting and different media in multiple posts, such as producer, satellite coordinator or fixer, among others.

Elinda Labropoulou is a freelance journalist and broadcaster based in Athens (Greece) working in English and Greek. She is currently the Greece stringer for CNN. She mainly covers news and current affairs and has worked for a number of international networks including the BBC, Al Jazeera and the Deutsche Welle. Her articles have been published in a number of publications including Time Magazine and The Independent.

Elinda has also written feature articles for the weekly supplements of a number of Greek newspapers including Kappa (Kathimerini), Vimagazino (To Vima), Epsilon (Eleftherotypia) and Tachydromos (Ta Nea). Her broadcasting work has been featured in ERT (TV), and Athina 98.4 (radio).

Danae Leivada was born in Athens. She has studied Mass Media and Communications at the University of Athens and has completed an M.A. in Legal and Political Theory at the University College of London. She is currently a part-time PhD research student in Politics and Law in the University of London and speaks English and French. She has worked as a professional translator for various companies.

Danae has written articles and carried out exclusive interviews for newspaper magazines like Geotropio (Eleftherotypia) and VimaMen (To Vima). She has also worked as a reporter and a freelance writer for newspapers (Apogevmatini) and as a producer for documentary production companies (Small Planet, Exandas Documentaries Series-ERT television). Today, she works for Forest Troop Ltd, one of the two production companies of ThePrismGR2010.



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The Production Coordinator:

Eleni Christodoulou was born in Athens, Greece in 1973. She has studied law at the Law University of Athens, and journalism at ANTI Journalism School.

She has significant experience in the marketing communications field. She has worked for leading companies such as J. Walter Thompson and Asset Ogilvy (Ogilvy Athens), where she was in charge of designing and implementing strategic communication projects, for which she has received two Ermis Awards.

She joined Forest Troop LTD in December 2010.

The Musicians:

Spyros Moschoutis was born in 1977 in Athens. He studied drums at The Collective and received a post-graduate degree (MMus) in Jazz Performance from The Guildhall School Of Music And Drama. Since 2003, he has been working in Athens. As a session drummer, he has collaborated with Foivos Delivorias, Panagiotis Kalatzopoulos, Evanthia Rempoutsika, Loudovikos Ton Anogion and many more, executing live performances and recordings. He is a member of The Burger Project, EOS and Abovo Theatre Company. Apart from that, he writes music for videos, sound installations, advertisements and pleasure.

Imam Baildi is a very popular Southeast Mediterranean dish consisting of aubergine stuffed with onion, garlic, and tomatoes and simmered in olive oil. It is a fine blend, such as the one offered by Lysandros (drums, percussion) and Orestis (DJ, programming) Falireas - only in musical terms!



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The Falireas brothers stem from a family with a long connection with Greek music genre rebetiko: their father owned both a record label specializing in the genre and a popular record shop in the center of Athens with a vast 78rpm vinyl collection. Therefore, the idea of mixing rebetiko with different types of music came about naturally to the siblings that grew up in such a rich musical environment.

Their self-titled debut was released in 2007 by EMI Greece and received great critical acclaim, followed by more than 130 live shows in Greece and around Europe, including support slots for Massive Attack, Ojos De Brujo and Gogol Bordello and performances at France's Transmusicales de Rennes and Denmark's Roskilde Festival.

Imam Baildi have just released their second collective project bearing the name "The Imam Baildi Cookbook".

Kerkville Composer/guitarist Michalis Moschoutis studied classical guitar at the Guildhall School of Music in London and at the Royal Conservatory of The Hague. He has taken part in many festivals in Europe and is performing extensively throughout Greece. His collaborators include many composers such as Nikos Tatsis and Chikage Imai as well as bands such as Apodراسi, Babas au Rhum, Imam Baildi. Under the guise of Kerkville, he is producing mainly guitar-based music. He is continuously working on expanding the expressive capacities of his main instrument: classical, acoustic, electric, lap steel, pedal steel and prepared guitars, and is experimenting on recording



techniques and sound-processing, aiming at creating "a distinct world of textures and harmonies".

Leon is singer/songwriter Leon Veremis from Athens, Greece. His music is a multicultural blend of sounds influenced by a variety of genres such as Greek and Mediterranean music, the new wave and pop tunes of the 70's, the Brooklyn indie rock scene and French euro-disco music of the 90's.

In late-2009, he formed the multi-member band "León" with other young multi-instrumentalists of the city. Debut album "Futtrue" is on the way, produced by Ottomo and Josh Clark (Beirut).

Guy Spyropoulos a.k.a. "Nebula", was born and raised in Athens, Greece. He moved to London in 1997 for his University studies. He later on moved to New York, where he composed music and completed further studies. In 2004, he moved back to London and founded a multimedia and web design company called Tera Media. He has composed music for the short documentary "Stranger: Bernie Worrell On Earth", about the life of genius keyboardist Bernie Worrell, for Discovery Channel documentary "Burning Man", and "Cave Durada" which was part of the soundtrack of film "Caravan of light" (released by Sony US).

The Goat Born in 1981 in northern Greece, Goat got interested in music production in 1997, using computer software (trackers) and some low quality drum machines. In 1999, he got more interested in music production as a founding member of Gozar Twins, an underground hip hop band, along with his brother Salazar. As years went by, he produced several LP's of the band(5) and, at the same time, worked with many underground hip hop bands and MCs and took part in many hip hop collections and live shows around Greece. In 2005, he moved to Athens and, shortly after, met Greek rapper Nikos Vourliotis of band Going Through, producing hit song "To Tragoudi mou".

The Production Designer:

Evangelos Kaimakis was born in Athens, Greece in 1977. He holds a B.Eng. in Product Design Engineering from the University of Glasgow and the Glasgow School of Art. In 2001 he was offered a scholarship for the two-year Master's MA course in Design Products at the Royal College of Art in London, from where he graduated with success.
